Dear Friend in Christ,

Time passes so quickly and I see that it's past time to communicate with you again. I am presently working on translating the Gospel of John. First drafts of Colossians and Philippians have recently been completed in the E'san language and are presently awaiting finishing... which will complete Paul's Minor Epistles.

Thank you for your financial support and prayer as faithful partners with us in one of the greatest, most important jobs on earth, i.e., bringing the Word of God to those still wanting. It is reassuring to know that you are solidly standing alongside us in this crucial task.

Just think, twenty-plus million people—one-third of the total population of Thailand—who speak the E'san language as their heart language, yet without the printed Word in their own language. Together, we are beginning to make a life-changing impact in these lives through the entrance of God's precious Word into their own language.

In my recent l-o-n-g four-page letter, I gave you a detailed account of what transpired on my trip to Northeast Thailand to check, print, and distribute I&II Thessalonians, I&II Timothy, and Titus in the E'san translation (what I call "T5" for short).

Towards the end of my recent trip, time began drawing to a close and it became unworkable for me to stay through the printing and distribution phases. Thus, I left the distribution in the hands of a very capable E'san believer, Mr. Banpote Wetchkamma (wait-gum-mah). SEE PICTURES ON ATTACHED PAGE

Banpote is an energetic stalwart preacher and teacher of the Gospel who is committed to preaching and teaching in the E'san language. He is well known and has been contacted many times lately by fellow E'san people asking where they can get copies of Ephesians and Galatians in E'san. (This shows that the E'san translation is gaining greater acceptance as time passes.)

I am also indebted to Brian Migliazza, missionary with Wycliffe Bible Translators, for helping with arrangements in my absence and in the distribution process. I understand the 2,000 copies went quickly. There is even an E'san church in Bangkok that received copies of the five Pastoral Epistles ("T5"). In the next printing I hope to be able to include all the minor epistles, along with Luke, John, and Genesis. I am delighted and encouraged with our progress.

Lord willing, I hope to be able to return to Thailand again in a few months (possibly next summer) to oversee the final checking of these new books, as well as update and revise other books previously printed, with the goal of printing a larger volume than ever before. Pray for God to provide more individuals and churches to partner with us to see this vital task accomplished in a timely and effective manner.
