Yet on a more serious note, there are two key thoughts in the text that I want to address: <u>Lost</u> and <u>Saved</u>. To be specific, **"Jesus saves!"** Saves how? Jesus saves us from the penalty, power, and finally the presence of sin, when we who are saved enter Heaven.

The best part is, this new life is given as a free gift by God Himself, the very moment one repents and receives Christ. In short, it is forgiveness full and free for anyone and everyone, owing solely to God's redeeming Love and Grace, paid for in full on the Cross by the Lord Jesus Christ. Consequently, we can't earn this by good works. In fact, as a free gift, it cannot be bought at any price.

I distinctly recall, at age 21, the moment I was convicted by God's Holy Spirit, and came to the stark realization that my unrighteous lifestyle had doomed me to Hell for all eternity, without any hope of Heaven whatsoever. Terror gripped my heart, to put it mildly, before a righteous and holy Creator. In my panic, I did the only thing I could; I cried out for mercy.

At that moment, a marvelous thing occurred; the panic was immediately displaced by a warm sense of peace and serenity!
