Continuing on, as I had mentioned in my most-recent newsletter, "Milestone," this last Friday (December 14th), Pastor Pitak and I finished the last remaining book—the Gospel of Matthew—meaning the completion of the New Testament translation into Isan, the spoken language of Northeast Thailand. That's 23-million speakers to date—one-third of Thailand's total population!

My original return date was rapidly approaching before the translation of Matthew was competed, so I was able move my return flight forward one week, to December 24th... a miracle in itself. Now, with extra time, I am able to concentrate on some things that

got tabled. Of these is the professional audio recording of the "Considering Creation" booklet. Locally, we have a radio announcer here in Nakon Panom whom I know quite well: Mr. Prome Pahn. A committed Buddhist, he offered to do the voice for me at no charge, saying he would be glad to do so. That means he too will get to read it! I plan to produce audio CDs, to further expand the potential listening audience of the "Considering Creation" evangelism story.

On December 18th, Pastor Pitak and I enjoyed a day of visiting believers and evangelizing areas in two district townships, 50 miles south of Nakon Panom, i.e., Na Kae and Renu Nakon. (My former assistant Jarat and I had evangelized throughout that area in the past) One growing house church that Pitak and I visited was in the village of Dong Ma-Ake, (photo at right). They gladly received the packets of "Considering Creation" booklets, saying they plan to use them to evangelize the whole neighborhood. They had heard about the booklets, but were unsure of how to get any. That day, I brought a supply to their doorstep!

We reviewed each of the suggestions offered by each member of our capable and thorough native Isan-speaker proofreading committee, whereupon we discussed and made all appropriate corrections or changes. These are all born-again, committed Christians. There really weren't all that many comments, making it possible to be finished by noontime. That means, for all practical purposes, we have now wrapped up the Isan book of Matthew, finalizing the translation of the Isan New Testament.

Believe it or not, after all these years, I finished pretty-much on schedule, according to the time-line laid out by Wycliffe Bible Translators for difficult languages—even after various delays and setbacks. God is faithful, as we remain focused and diligent!

(**Note** my walking cane, hanging from the edge of the table, where it has remained for a few days. The Sciatica problem in my left hip area is slowly improving—slowly being the operative term—since the spinal injection I received at Sharp Grossmont Hospital, a few days before I flew to Thailand (November 10th).
